A Co-operation between Ombudsmen from Eastern Partnership Countries (EP)

The Project of Co-operation between Ombudsmen from EP Countries has been designed as one of the undertakings implemented by the Polish side as a part of EU policy on Eastern Partnership:

- The Defender of Rights of the French Republic was invited to participate in the Project,
- The Project is directed to Ombudsman institutions in: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine,
- The co-operation has been designed for years 2009-2013.

A Co-operation between Ombudsmen from Eastern Partnership Countries (EP)

- Ombudsmen from Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine expressed their willingness to participate in the Project,
- The Project gained approval of the President of the Republic of Poland, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland and the Committee for European Integration,
- Until now the project obtained financial support from Polish Foreign Assistance provided by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland for the years 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The Objectives of the Ombudsmen Co-operation Project

The main objectives of the Project are:

- Reinforcement the EP countries ombudsman institutions' ability to participate in the creation of a democratic state honouring individual's rights,
- Creation of conditions for realization of right to court in the EP countries included in the project through improvement of the judiciary body functioning,

The Objectives of the Ombudsmen Co-operation Project

- Support for non-governmental organizations contributing to the development of civil society in the EP countries,
- Improvement of civil service functions through promotion of good practices in administration,
- Supporting and securing freedom of speech and media.

The Beneficiaries of the Ombudsmen Co-operation Project

The main beneficiaries of the Project are:

- Ombudsmen of the EP countries included in the Project,
- The bodies of the administration of justice,
- The bodies of public administration,
- Non-governmental organizations operating in these countries,
- Journalists and free press organizations.

The primary tasks of Ombudsmen Co-operation Project

The project tasks are to be accomplished through following assignments:

- Organization of a series of workshops and trainings on human and civil rights protection,
- Monitoring the situation of prisoners in countries within the Project as well as implementing mechanisms of preventing torture,

The primary tasks of Ombudsmen Co-operation Project

- Promotion of The European Code of Good Administrative Behaviour,
- Analysis of EP countries national law regulations paying special attention to adaptation to European standards of individual's rights protection,
- Realization of research and scientific projects.

Leading subjects for the years 2010-2013

International conferences organized in countries included in the Project, initiating each thematic year:

- 2010 Year of Solidarity,
- 2011 Year against violence and discrimination,
- 2012 Year of basic civil liberties,
- 2013 Year of rule of law.

First stage of the Project realization priorities

In the first stage of the Ombudsmen Co-operation Project (2009) the priorities have been:

- A thorough analysis of EP countries ombudsman offices' mode of functioning,
- A precise definition of problems and needs, fulfilment of which should reinforce institutions already in function.

In year 2009 the following events took place:

- Workshop on "The state of the observance of human rights and freedoms in the countries included in the Eastern Partnership Programme"
 - ▶ 22-25 October 2009 College of Europe in Natolin (Poland)
 - ▶ Discussed topics: freedom of speech, freedom of assembly, right to court and actions against torture and inhuman treatment

- ▶ Discussion on challenges, problems and needs of the ombudsman institutions and for the protection of human rights and freedoms
