ENGAGING MEN TO SUPPORT GENDER EQUALITY: FROM AWARENESS TO ACTION



The OSCE has long been committed to advancing gender equality, with a particular emphasis on the vital role that men and boys play in achieving this objective. In December 2023, the OSCE hosted the conference "Women and Men: Working Together for Equal Rights", resulting in the OSCE Policy and Practice Recommendations on Engaging Men. A recent conference hosted by CHANGE and WIN, two OSCE projects working in this area led to the OSCE Policy and Practice Recommendations on Engaging Men. At this event the recommendations will be presented along with the "Sarajevo Recommendations on Engaging Male Politicians as Critical Actors for Gender Equality in Politics". While emphasis on the constructive engagement of men to support gender equality is key to achieving substantive gender equality, it is also important to support men to deliver on gender equality. At the same time, further support is needed to assist traditional advocates for gender equality and strengthen institutional mechanisms and gender mainstreaming.

Discuss Future Initiatives:

Identify opportunities to expand men's engagement and strengthen support for gender equality initiatives within the OSCE and across its participating states.
